Purpose:

Under the supervision of the PSS/GBV Officer, the incumbent will be responsible for day-to-day management of activities at the women friendly spaces working closely with women, girls and other relevant stakeholders.

Key Roles and Responsibilities

- Under the supervision of the PSS/GBV Officer, the GBV case workers will be responsible for establishment of an effective case management system and ensure that all cases reported are supported/referred to appropriate service providers.
- Ensure that the guiding principles for case management are adhered to and use appropriate data collection tools
- Work with various community groups to provide appropriate support services for GBV survivors through training and mentoring them to strengthen the community referral mechanisms
- Run the women friendly spaces/gender advise desks and provide relevant information to women, children and men who visit the center.
- Provide immediate psychosocial support to survivors of GBV through the women friendly spaces.
- Participate in organizing relevant key events like international women's day, 16 days of activism etc.
- Use participatory methodology within the community to create awareness raising messages and conduct awareness to promote behavior change towards prevention and response to GBV issues.
- Correctly record all relevant information on GBV services offered using relevant tools that include intake forms, consent forms etc.
- Prepare and submit relevant reports on a weekly and monthly basis.
- Perform any other duty as assigned by the supervisor.

Qualifications and experience

- Certificate in basic counseling.
- At least three years' experience working with an NGO in a similar position.

- Interested in working with girls, boys, women, and children
- Demonstrate cultural, gender, religious, nationality and age sensitivity
- Great team player, excellent communication skills, maintains good working relationships and ability to work under minimum supervision.
