Job overview

To facilitate achievement of the medical objectives to reduce morbidity and mortality by provision of emergency healthcare services to the returnees in Renk Transit centre (TC).

The Clinical officer will provide daily consultation at the TC clinic and also cover emergency room (stabilisation room). The staff duty roster will also include night cover at the TC clinic.

Main Responsibilities/ Duties

The Clinical officer is responsible for:

Medical / Technical

- Provide consultations with diagnosis and treatment of illnesses based on the guidelines of South Sudan and focusing on IECHC
- Prescribe medications and instruct patients on correct usage
- Oversee the emergency i.e stabilise all patients before referral.
- Review all patients' set for referral ensuring that all pre-referral medication are administered.
- Provide patient education and instruct on prevention methods for illness, proper nutrition, and hygiene
- Compile weekly and monthly reports required by the Ministry of Health as well as UNHCR and provide to health manager or team leader

- Ensure all patients are treated based on the Guidelines of the Ministry of Health and the IECHC guidelines

 The role of the Clinical Officer cannot be limited to the specific duties and tasks detailed herein. The success of the RI's humanitarian mission is the highest priority and all issues which arise must be addressed accordingly. Therefore, the midwife will be required to support in unforeseen issues and circumstances and remain flexible to perform other duties, as and when required by supervisor.

Qualification and Minimum Requirements:

Applicants should:

- Diploma in clinical medicine from a recognized training Institution
- Have at least 2 years working experience preferably in a resource limited and hostile environment setting. Previous working experience in an INGO setting is an added advantage
- have excellent interpersonal communication skills
- have very good record keeping, accurate reporting skills
- be able to work on multiple tasks and in difficult situation and meet deadlines;
- be able to speak and write in English and Arabic
- Able to work with minimum supervision
- be computer literate especially Excel and Word packages
- Experience working in refugee settings in South Sudan
