JOB SUMMARY

CARE International in South Sudan is implementing a multi-sectoral project in collaboration with Coalition for humanity with funding from German Federal Foreign Office (GFFO). CARE's work is located in Pariang (Rweng Administrative area) and Renk, Upper Nile state, focusing on Gender-Responsive Food Security, WASH, GBV and Primary Health Services for Women, Girls and Crisis-Affected Communities Impacted by the Sudan Conflict. The Project Officer – (Agronomy) will contribute to the Food security of the most vulnerable conflict-affected households is improved, with reduced reliance on negative coping strategies (approx. 38% of project volume).



Responsibilities and Tasks:

Production & Extension

- Establishment and strengthening of beneficiary identification/advisory committees and complaints; participants registration, verification and targeting in line with humanitarian principles.

- Support to and referral of SAM/MAM cases to nutritional rehabilitation services, in coordination with health and nutrition actors.
- Formation and strengthening of refugees, returnees and host community farmer groups; establishment of home and kitchen gardens through provision of seeds, tools and inputs; and practical demonstrations.
- Promotion of good dietary practices and the IYCF approach through behavior change communication.
- Facilitation of regular group-based sessions (e.g. women-led initiatives) to identify food security risks, reflect on challenges, and co-create context-specific food security action plans.

GVB and case management

- Providing safe, confidential and inclusive environments for psychosocial support, group counselling, structured healing activities, and life-skills and livelihoods-related activities for women and adolescent girls.
- Provision of comprehensive case management to survivors of GBV including linkages with other services, in line with inter-agency GBV guidelines.
- Provision of comprehensive case management to survivors on GBV prevention and response, survivor-centered approaches, Psychological First Aid (PFA), PSEA and safe referrals

MEAL & Learning

- Collect quality field data, conduct routine monitoring, and document success stories.
- Support baseline/midline/endline, outcome tracking, and learning events.
- Jointly conduct baseline and mid-term market assessments and regular market price monitoring.
- Participatory safety audits identifying protection risks and priority mitigation actions in target communities including mapping of GBV actors and referral pathways, to identify service gaps and inform adaptive programming.

Safeguarding & Compliance

- Embed gender equality and protection measures in farmer engagement; ensure safe, inclusive participation of women and youth.
- Comply with CARE security protocols and incident reporting

Education/Training

- Minimum of a bachelor's degree in agriculture, food security and community development, with at least 3 years' experience implementing food security and livelihoods project at field level



- Experience in Village Saving and Loans Association (VSLA) and farming as a business will be an added advantage

Required

- Bachelors in Agronomy, Agriculture, Agricultural Extension, or related field.

Experience/Technical Skills

- 3-5 years of previous professional experience in a similar position. Examples: planning; budgeting; word-processing, basic accounting; advanced written communications; presentations; fundraising; training/facilitation, etc

- 3–5 years implementing agriculture/livelihood projects with strong extension skills.
- Experience with climate-smart practices, post-harvest management.
- Experience in kitchen gardening and management practices.
- Experience in implementing nutrition sensitive agriculture practices.
- Familiarity with VSLAs/financial literacy and linkages to markets.
- Field mobility and experience working with community structures and authorities.
- Practical agronomy and adult learning facilitation.
- Community mobilization, coaching lead farmers, and inclusive approaches.
- Data collection/quality; basic budgeting and planning; report writing.
- Languages: English; Arabic is an advantage.
