Summary of Job Description

The Senior GBV Prevention officer will be responsible for the overall supervision of the implementation of the GBV Prevention/Outreach activities implemented as part of the



GBV Program funded by ECHO in Canal Pigi County. This also include the implementation of SASA! And the direct supervision of Community Outreach Workers.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Supervise the general implementation of the prevention component of the GBV Program.
- Provide training on GBV Basic Concepts/topics to Community leaders, staff from IMC and other agencies
- Build capacity of Community Outreach Workers and Community structures such as SASA! Community activists and GBV Taskforce members to effectively conduct planned activities.
- Compile data from the Prevention Component for the Weekly and monthly reports
- Complete the KOBO monthly reports for IMC Canal Pigi Field Site.
- Lead the monitoring and evaluation strategies for the Prevention Component.
- Co-facilitate in collaboration with the Senior GBV Response Officer the monthly and quarterly AAP meetings.
- Participate in assessments and lead the Safety Audits in Nyal.
- Support the GBV Manager as Needed and required.
- Contribute to a positive IMC team management.

Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse

- Actively promote PSEA (Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) standards within IMC and amongst, vendors-suppliers and beneficiaries served by IMC.

Compliance & Ethics: Promotes and encourages a culture of compliance and ethics throughout International Medical Corps. As applicable to the position, maintains a clear understanding of International Medical Corps' and donor compliance and ethics standards and adheres to those standards. Conducts work with the highest level of integrity.

Ethical conduct for IMC staffs: The International Medical Corps maintains a code of standards of conduct that shall govern the performances of its employees engaged in the award and administration of contracts. These standards shall provide for disciplinary actions to be applied for violations of such standards by IMC officers, employees, or agents.

- Diploma in Social Development or equivalent or 4-year work experience in GBV Programming, plus other work certificates including trainings from GBV, Protection, Health Education, Community Health Worker, and Human Rights etc. A degree in the related fields will be an added advantage.
- Ability to cope and work long hours in the field site.
- Good oral and written English language a necessity, Arabic and local language are added advantage.
- High flexibility and ability to work and coordinate with those who are under your supervision.
- To be efficient to the program in reporting system.
- Strong teamwork skills
