Purpose of the position:

World Vision is providing essential health care services in South Sudan, with interventions in Yambio and Nzara Counties, Western Equatoria State, designed to: enhance delivery of integrated health services, expand community health services for prevention and treatment, and support stable health systems that are responsive and accountable to the needs of communities and individuals accessing these services. To ensure thoughtful implementation considering the unique needs of vulnerable and at-risk groups, World Vision is seeking Maternal, New born Child Health Coordinator to lead the implementation of Maternal and New Born Child Health Interventions in the HPF project in Western Equatoria. The incumbent will work closely with the County Coordinators, Gyn and Obs specialist, Midwives, Clinical Officers and Nurses to improve the quality of reproductive health services. He/she will ensure that MNCH/RH (BEMoNC, CEMoNC, newborn child health etc) indicators are on track.

Roles and Responsibilities:

Project Implementation

- Ensure a well-equipped and functional CEMoNC centre within YSH and BEMOnC in all PHCCs.
- Ensure proper obstetric and gynaecological cases based on the South Sudan treatment guidelines and protocols.
- Participate in monitoring the drugs and medical consumables consumption to ensure effective but cost-effective utilization of medicines and medical consumables.
- Assist the health facilities to prepare a list of equipment, drugs and medical consumables orders related to MNCH.



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- Assist with developing of teaching r resources, materials and programs for the midwives, medical officers and other nursing staff.
- Collaborate and work closely with the senior midwife in-charge on maternity ward to meet established customer service care for the inpatients.
- Ensure a well-equipped and functional theatre but conducting regular assessments of equipment needed and training staff as appropriate.
- Ensure 100% signal functions in YSH and PHCCs in Yambio and Nzara
- Collaborate with the medical doctors and midwives in the hospital to develop and implement continuing medical education for clinical staff through scheduled training sessions and educational presentations.
- Conduct maternal advocacy campaigns through radio and through various for a in the state.
- o Ensure effective infection prevention and control in the maternity and theatre.
- Organise special surgical camps related to maternal health.

Training and supervision

- Provide supervision and leadership of midwives and medical officers including assessment of clinic al competence and implementation of evidenced medical practices.
- o Review medical officers and clinical officers, and other clinical staffs' performance, adherence to guidelines and protocols to ensure quality of care.
- Provide capacity building to the doctors, midwives, nurses and students through on job coaching and mentorship.
- o Facilitate BEMOnC, CEMOnC and other maternal related trainings within the Lot.
- Ensure JDs for midwives are given to staff and that regular regular performance reviews are done in consultation with HF in charges

Strategic leadership and Representation

- As directed by the HPF Project Manager, represent World Vision at the MNCH clinics.
- Organise weekly departmental and monthly meetings to examine performance and improve on weak areas.
- O Document success stories and share with the hospital coordinator for publishing
- o Provide leader ship in the implementation of MNCH services at the facility and within communities in the Project area as guided by the project objectives, logical framework and work plan; as guided by the southern Sudan health Policy
- Oversee BeMONC implementation at PHCCs and PHCUs.
- O Supervise Health Facility staff in the department of maternal health
- o Establish and maintain effective project reporting, evaluation, and communication systems.

Reporting

- o Make RH commodities request to UNFPA and report on monthly basis.
- o Ensure monthly MNCH drug consumptions reports are provided for the department.
- o Ensure weekly and monthly activity reports are provided for the department.
- o Ensure evidence data use within the department.
- Provide timely drug and equipment request to the Project Manager for timely procurement.



Knowledge/Qualifications for the Role.

- Medical degree in medicine or midwifery. A master's degree in obstetrics from a recognized medical is strongly desired.

- Experience in working with NGOS in humanitarian setting is preferred.
- Experience in a management r ole, supervision and mentoring junior clinical staff preferred.
- Experience supervising health workers and volunteers.
- Experience managing field office operations.
- Strong CEMOnC and BEMOnC skills
- Basic experience in procurement and supply, and management of pharmaceuticals
- Effective in written and verbal communication in English.
- Medical degree (MD, MBChB) or degree in midwifery from a recognized medical institution.
- Licensed to Practice by the Medical Council of South Sudan.
- Excellent verbal and written use of the English language required;
- Strong communication skills especially with those of different cultures, with excellent written and spoken English and Arabic is preferred.
