Who we are:

Overall purpose of the role:

The Shelter Specialist provides the required leadership and technical knowledge to ensure that DRC responds timely to the shelter and settlement needs of IDP's and host community in Unity State with a particular focus on Persons with Specific Needs. The Shelter & Settlement Specialist will be responsible for planning, implementing and evaluating shelter, settlement infrastructures and all DRC construction activities in Unity state. He / she coordinates with the other DRC departments and partners, including UNHCR, IOM and WASH partners in ensuring effective quality delivery of services.

Responsibilities:

- Contributes to the development and implementation of the shelter strategy, actively
 participates in project proposals writing, reporting and assessments / evaluations,
- Develops Shelter and settlement infrastructure bill of quantities and technical designs,
- Responsible for planning, implementing, following-up and supervising DRC shelter.
 settlement and construction activities in DRC operational areas, and ensures quality implementation through regular systematic field monitoring,
- Ensures that the project targets the beneficiaries most in need of protection by exploring and assessing new and better ways to assist, in collaboration with the DRC CCCM and Protection/GBV teams.
- Develop and/or adapt a work plan for shelter, settlement and construction activities and
 ensure progress and quality in line with applicable international standards and agreements.
 Shelter and settlement activities will include, but not be limited to:
 - Road infrastructure activities which includes drainages, culverts and road rehabilitation and repairs.
 - Construction of emergency and transitional shelters
 - Construction of communal infrastructure (including both traditional structures using local materials and semi-permanent, and permanent buildings).
 - Construction of buildings to support other projects, training centers, community centers, field offices etc.
- Supervises contractors and suppliers, ensuring that deliveries take place according to the quantity and quality agreed,
- Participate in camp coordination meetings, ensuring that community members are regularly updated on construction progress and constraints.
- Identify gaps in shelter and settlement provision to IDP's and host community, proactively referring those gaps to the relevant sector.
- Mobilizes and trains settlement maintenance teams to ensure drainages are kept clean and that there is no construction on access roads.
- Maps all Settlement development activities using the GPS and provide input for overall development and update of the settlement site plans and maps,
- Liaise and collaborate with relevant sectors including CCCM, ECR, Protection/GBV and others in implementation of shelter, settlement and construction activities.
- Provide regular progress reports to the Area manager on shelter and settlement activities





- Ensure that the organization's financial, supply chain, security and human resources policies and procedures are fully adhered to and implemented,
- Ensure that DRC's Code of Conduct is respected and implemented by all stakeholders: national staff, casual labor, suppliers
