Organizational Background

International Medical Corps is a global, humanitarian, nonprofit organization dedicated to saving lives and relieving suffering through health care training and relief and development programs.

By offering training and health care to local populations and medical assistance to people at highest risk, and with the flexibility to respond rapidly to emergency situations, International Medical Corps rehabilitates devastated health care systems and helps bring them back to self-reliance.

Essential Job duties / Scope of Work:

1. Provide support and training (chlorinators, sprayers, waste managers and other members of the WASH Team) in the implementation of WASH interventions to provide ready access to safe water and adequate sanitation facilities at the COVID-19 Facility
2. Participate in WASH IPC meetings and representation at state level
3. Reporting (daily, weekly and monthly) to his supervisor
4. Organize and maintain adequate stock of WASH IPC materials to be used at the COVID-19 Facility on a daily basis.
5. Ensure the operation and maintenance of all WASH facilities at the COVID-19 Facility.
6. Keep track of IPC staff attendance, number of times per shift per person, etc.
7. Do hands-on work with dead body preparation, dead body handovers, disinfection and other tasks of the waste managers, sprayers, chlorinator, etc.



Required Qualifications (Special training/experience required)

1. Degree/Diploma in Environmental studies or public health or any other specialization regarding water sanitation and hygiene.
2. Two (2) years' experience in and sound knowledge of the technical aspects of water and sanitation facilities suitable for emergency situations in any related field.
3. Formal technical qualifications in an engineering or related discipline such as plumbing would be an advantage.
4. Reasonable communication skills in English (spoken and written) and local language (Spoken)
5. Previous experience as a IPC WASH officer in a hospital setting is a plus
