Project Summary:

The South Sudan Monitoring and Evaluation Support Project (MESP) will conduct a baseline household survey to gather data for indicators included in the new USAID South Sudan Mission country strategy. The indicators are part of the performance management plan for USAID/South Sudan's strategy in the country, which will serve as the Mission's tool for effective management of results in order to achieve the best possible development outcomes that allow for evidence-based decision making, learning, and adaptation. The baseline household survey will be implemented in seven counties – Baliet (Upper Nile), Jur River (Western Bahr el Ghazal), Kapoeta North (Eastern Equatoria), Mayendit (Unity), Panyijiar (Unity), Ulang (Upper Nile), and Wau (Western Bahr el Ghazal) – between July and September 2021. MESP requires enumerators to administer the baseline household survey questionnaire.

Please note: Only people authorized to work in South Sudan are eligible for this position

Position Summary:

The enumerators will administer the household survey questionnaire in local communities, collecting data directly from heads of household. Enumerators will have responsibilities prior to, during, and after data collection. The consultancy is up to 40 working days between July through October 2021.

Responsibilities:

Prior to Data Collection

- Attend all the survey administration training classes.
- · Study the household survey questionnaire.
- Understand the formatting of the questionnaire and how to carefully navigate through the questions.
- Obtain all the materials needed to perform your work daily before you go to the field.
- Work with the Supervisor to ensure the boma official and the village chief(s) have been informed
 of your presence in the enumeration area.

During Data Collection

- Conduct the listing of households in assigned Enumeration Areas.
- Travel around the enumeration area to identify the selected households for the interview.

- Participate in the selection of the households for the study in the enumeration area. Prepare visit plan with Supervisor to show the path to take while carrying out interviews.
- Visit each of the household selected and identify an acceptable respondent for interview.
- Interview respondents, accurately administering the household survey questionnaire and completely collecting all data according to instructions on the questionnaire.

After Data Collection

- Verify all households in enumeration area visited and all interviews conducted for the day.
- Review the questionnaires to ensure that all questions are completed and correctly marked.

Qualifications:

- Have minimum level of school certificate (South Sudan) or ordinary level certificate (Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania, Rwanda) or its equivalent.
- 5 years of experience in the humanitarian or international development sectors.
- Experience collecting data in South Sudan, experience with previous household surveys preferred.
- Knows how to fill out the household questionnaire bubble sheet.
- Knowledge of using tablets for data collection (if data will be collected using tablets) and data collection apps.
- Experience in conducting FGDs and KIIs.
- Familiar with the culture of the community.
- Understands protocols of the local authority.
- Able to speak, read, and write English.
- Understands the county context and local language(s) of the county.
