Organizational background

POSITION DESCRIPTION

The MEAL Officer will work closely with IMA UNFPA team to ensure the efficient, effective, and timely delivery of the UNFPA-funded project, in line with UNFPA country programme results. More specifically, the MEAL Officer is responsible for establishing and maintaining a practical system for monitoring and evaluation of the entire UNFPA portfolio, including the Human Resources for Sexual Reproductive Health and Gender-based Violence 'HR4SRH&GBV Programme" and UNFPA regular emergency Sexual Reproductive Health and Gender in emergencies, and Youth participation in leadership, SRH/GBViE and CES/Youth programmes.

The MEAL Officer will work in an integrated manner with the programme and technical staff in IMA and partner organizations to ensure the use of results-based indicators, project data collection and analysis to inform programming and readjustment processes.

In addition, the MEAL Officer will play a critical role in IMA's on-going efforts to improve MEAL using the internal 3D data management system, as well as working to achieve a transformative result with three zeros in South Sudan, namely: zero preventable maternal deaths, zero unmet needs of family planning and zero gender based violence including child marriages, particularly by ensuring better integrated and coordinated programme delivery.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

Implementation of Programme, Monitoring, Evaluation, Learning and Reporting Activities

- Support the effective implementation of the UNFPA-funded project's annual work plans with focus on results monitoring, objective hierarchy, indicators and monitoring mechanisms, tools, and procedures.
- Support the preparation of projects MEAL plan capturing qualitative and quantitative aspects according to the annual work plans.
- Contribute to the design and set out the framework and procedures for the monitoring and evaluation of project activities, with implementing partners, programme teams and the UNFPA project team leader.
- Ensure that activities/events needed for monitoring are scheduled and responsibilities assigned.
- Collect monitoring evidence that the results are being produced as intended and are efficient, including on disability inclusion.
- Support UNFPA project staff and implementing partners in preparing their data collection and reports.
- Utilize the MEAL information system, updating the projects, activities, and indicators on a routine basis.

Analysis and Reporting of Monitoring and Evaluation activities

- Support the UNFPA Project Manager and teams with data management and identify project issues and prompt corrective actions to enhance the achievement of results.
- Collect data from the relevant project stakeholders including persons with disabilities organizations, youth, women, etc. and conduct data analysis to measure performance against the indicators and targets.
- Support the development and testing of MEAL methods, tools, DHIS2, and assist in the implementation of recommendations to improve the efficiency of current monitoring systems.
- Assist in the development and update of projects MEAL framework and matrix ensuring gender, age and disability segregation across all the UNFPA project core areas of work: SRH, GBV, early childhood marriage/harmful practices, and data collection/analysis.
- Review monitoring reports, analyse them for quality, completeness, impact evaluation and identify the causes of potential bottlenecks in project implementation.
- Draft regular MEAL programme reports and assist the programme reviews and evaluations.
- Prepare consolidated progress reports on MEAL findings for project management to submit to M&E Specialist, in accordance with approved reporting formats and timing
- Lead in the analysis (and visualization) of project data to present clear and concise reports for IMA, stakeholders, and donors.

REQUIREMENTS

Minimum Qualification required:

 Bachelor's degree or advanced Diploma in M&E, statistics, economics, demography, social science, or any related subject matter.

Technical Skills & Abilities:

- A minimum of 3 years of relevant work experience in MEAL and experience working in SRH/GBV, protection, women's empowerment, research and capacity building and health systems strengthening programming.
- Experience in designing and rolling out MEAL tools, including: participatory assessment, surveys, monitoring and evaluation frameworks, training and facilitation, data processing and analysis.
- Willingness to undertake regular field visits to remote locations for periods of 1+ weeks.
- Computer and information technology literacy, including demonstrated expertise in Microsoft Excel and Word, online reporting and matrix/ result-based programming. Preferred experience with data analysis software, including SPSS, STATA, NVivo, etc.
- Fluent in English and Arabic. Knowledge of local language preferred.
- Demonstrated experience in implementing beneficiary complaint and feedback mechanisms.
