



## Terms of Reference for

### **COMBINED IDSR IPC AND INTEGRATED TRAINING IN PARIANG SSHF PROJECT**

#### **Organisation Overview:**

Founded in 1945, CARE International seeks a world of hope, tolerance and social justice, where poverty has been overcome and people living in dignity and security. Operating in more than 80 countries, CARE seeks to be a global force and partner of choice within a worldwide movement dedicated to ending poverty. CARE strives to serve individuals and families in the poorest communities in the world. CARE is committed to a multi-pronged programming approach, working alongside with governments and other actors to help save and improve lives.

#### **Programme Overview:**

CARE is the health partner for Pariang Hospital providing comprehensive services, maternal, surgical paediatric and medical consultations with in-patient and out-patient services. The project is funded by UNHCR, UNICEF and HPF2 providing comprehensive health and nutrition services to the population. CARE secured funds under SSHF for health and nutrition. The objective of the SSHF health project is to provide health and nutrition interventions for the disaster-affected populations in Pariang and Aweil through:

- management of severe (complicated and non-complicated) and moderate acute malnutrition among under-five children, management of malnutrition in PLW
- conducting preventive nutrition interventions among under-fives-MIYCN/IYCF-E
- continuous monitoring, surveillance and analysis of the evolving nutrition situation.
- increased access to integrated nutrition, health, WASH, FSL and protection interventions
- improving universal access to primary healthcare services by scaling up responsiveness for preventive and curative services which aligns with the 3 South Sudan health cluster objectives

The project will target IDPs, vulnerable host community members and returnees.

As part of the activity and the need to achieve above objectives; CARE would like to provide health workers with a combined training on IDSR, IPC integrated response training in both Pariang and Aweil.

#### **Consultancy Objectives:**

The consultant will be required to provide comprehensive combined training on IDSR, IPC integrated response training in both Pariang and Aweil. The consultant (s) will need to provide a structured format to provide class oriented sessions.

**The main objectives:** will be to provide comprehensive combined training on IDSR, IPC and integrated response

#### **The specific objectives:**

The following topics will be expected to be covered:

1. Integrated disease surveillance
2. Infection prevention control
3. Integrated response

#### **Purpose of Training**

The primary purpose of this evaluation is to provide health workers with valuable skills and knowledge on IDSR, IPC and integrated response for more effective provision of integrated health services in Pariang.



## Methodology:

The consultancy design should provide a combined approach of both class theory and demonstration. These combinations of appropriate methods should include but not be limited to:

1. Class sessions covering basic theory and latest guidelines on the IDSR, IPC and integrated response in line with MOH guidelines.
2. Pre-test and post-test to evaluate learning gained by the team
3. Handouts prepared and distributed to the staff trained.

The consultant will be expected to visit Pariang for a period of 4 working days excluding travel dates and work directly with the team in achieving the deliverables highlighted.

- The consultant is expected to debrief CARE, and its partners on the evaluation findings. Upon obtaining feedback from the team, he/she will finalise and submit a final report to CARE.

## Scope of the Training

The scope of the training shall be focused on health workers working in Ruweng including partner's organisations to improve their skills and knowledge.

## Deliverables and timeline

A comprehensive training schedule covering the above listed topics for the 4 working days. The training is to be done over a period of 1 week of class sessions.

A final training report indicating which staff attended, and sessions covered including signing attendance forms.

A form of assessment of learning to evaluate progress and knowledge base of staff trained.

Identify key learning challenges and future training plans for the team on other aspects of IDSR, IPC and integrated response, with key recommendations.

The aforementioned deliverables will be accompanied by regular communication with and feedback to the Programme Team.

The assignment should be completed **by latest 29<sup>th</sup> November 2019**

**Essential Qualifications and experience Required:**

- Consultant should preferably be a south sudanese
- Consultant should preferably be a holder of graduate or post graduate degree in emergency medicine
- Has several certificates on infection preventions, disease surveillance
- Demonstrated experience of progressive career development in IDSR, IPC
- Demonstrated ability to teach and capacity build of staff through class demonstration sessions.
- Experience of working in South Sudan/East Africa
- Ability to deal with hardship and remote area field work

**Preferred**

- An experienced trainer on IPC and IDSR
- A medical doctor with public health experience
- Previous history of doing similar trainings in a similar context.
- Ability to understand the local language will be an added advantage.
- English report writing skills
- Experience of working in insecure environments in South Sudan and managing security risks
- Action-oriented and evidence based approach and strong drive for results
- Highly developed self-management, and communication skills;

**Guiding Principles and Values:**

Adherence to CARE Code of conduct, Child Safeguarding practices and confidentiality when



interviewing or photographing children.

**Application process**
