Job title: Protection Officer
Reporting to: Project Coordinator – (NFIs)
Location: Juba, with Frequent travels to the field
Availability: As soon as possible

Purpose of the position:

To support implementation of SNFI activities for the effective and efficient realization of project goals. The job holder will provide oversight support to ensure donor and WV's policies and procedures (including Mainstreaming of AAAP, Gender, Protection and partners-coordination). S/he will participate in assessment, verification/registration and SNFI distribution missions through the mobile-response modality to provide technical guide during interventions.

Key Job responsibilities

- Ensure SNFI needs assessment and verification use Age/Gender/Diversity approach, and Focus Group Discussions and Key Informants Interviews target most vulnerable and marginalized groups.
- Conduct mobilization among the affected population for awareness raising activities with the SNFI teams as well as partner organizations, disseminating information about protection, SNFI assistance available, feedback and complaints mechanisms, SEA, GBV risks and prevention, entitlements relevant to the IDP and Returnee population.
- Support with identification of most vulnerable affected population and persons with specific needs (PSNs) or to follow-up on identified PSNs during SNFI Responses
- Conduct Safety Audit before distribution and incorporate into assessment and distribution



reports.

- Assist in the collection of protection data relevant to the IDP and Returnees in line with safe, ethical and data protection principles as well as protection principles such as prioritize safety, do no harm and meaningful inclusion.
- Support the mainstreaming of protection principles to WV's Shelter-NFI program, including partners and the local community.
- Ensure local community structures represent interests of various beneficiaries including PSN
- Incorporate Protection inputs in Assessment, monitoring and distribution reports
- Perform any other duties that may be assigned or delegated by SNFI Coordinator

Qualifications/Education/Knowledge/Technical Skills and Experience

The following may be acquired through a combination of formal or self-education, prior experience or on-the-job training:

- University Degree in Social Sciences, Education, sociology, Political science, Legal Studies or International/community development;
- At least 2 years' experience in working with International NGOs with relevant community focus
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively with beneficiary communities, Government and other stakeholders at the district level;
- Experience in training and community consultation highly desired
- Experience in facilitating focus group discussions with local communities and reporting.
- Commitment to and understanding of international humanitarian standards, especially the Red Cross and Red Crescent Code of Conduct, Sphere, and the Humanitarian Accountability Partnership (HAP) Standard;
- Ability to work in a cross-cultural context with people of various backgrounds;
- Modeling of accountable practice through personal actions and approaches to program management;
- Willingness to participate in chapel and group devotions; and
- Commitment to WV Core Values and Mission Statement.
- Must demonstrate patience, tolerance, problem solving, open-mindedness and interest in social justice.
- Works independently with minimum supervision.
- Excellent communication skills in English and Juba Arabic strongly preferred.
- Mature in faith.
