The intern supports in defining GBV legal redress mechanisms, learns about the divergence and convergence of the customary laws and statutory laws, interacts with the bench court, and community paralegals in supporting access to justice for GBV and HLP survivors

This internship will support the development of the intern professional experience and expose the intern to the Coalition for Humanity work environment providing assigned tasks satisfactorily. The program Intern is responsible for assisting in the implementation of assigned project activities; this is a full-time assignment and working hours run between 8:00 am to 5:00 pm Monday to Friday based in the field locations.
