Preferably, the consultant will have prior experience working in the sectors including Food-Security & Livelihood, Nutrition and WASH, Education, Skills and Opportunities for Youth Employment and Entrepreneurship (SOYEE), Children and Youth Leadership, Sexual Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and Child Protection in Emergencies (CPiE) in South Sudan and designing programs that are aimed around consolidating best practices, evaluating, and scaling up of innovative ideas.



Specific Tasks to be performed by the Consultant: Consultancy will activate based on solicitation and also GO decision made by the Management. If not already done by the start of the consultancy, help to identify appropriate implementation/research partners to enhance the evaluation/learning component of the project.

Meet with key relevant stakeholders in South Sudan as needed to ensure that the program design integrates expertise from all relevant actors/sectors, including private sector, social ventures, academia, institutes, Government departments, and others as needed.

Work with relevant proposal design team formed by the Plan International South Sudan to identify the staffing needs/organogram for the proposed programs.

Facilitate the proposal design workshop, and consolidate workshop outcome, and outline key roles to work on specific section of the proposal, agree, and follow up with the key milestones in collaboration with the Business Development Team of Plan International.

Lead drafting a quality concept note/proposal with all annexes and especially logframe and budget; also engage proposal development team to review, and finalize the proposal design document.

Qualifications and Experience

Strong programme design skills, including capacity to prepare logical framework, theory of change, problem analysis, defining interventions, program approaches, project governance, value for money, stakeholders' analysis, risk analysis, coherent, and consistent documents including proposal narrative and financial planning.

Prior demonstrated experience developing winning proposals for institutional donors including but not limited to bi-lateral, multi-lateral, corporate, and UN Agencies.

Ability to work efficiently and effectively with project members in various locations and from multiple organizations, including remotely writing and revising proposal documents.
