INTRODUCTION

Purpose of the position:

This position is an intermediate technical and supervisory position

Under general supervision of the OPD in charge and Head nurse the Triage officer performs care coordination and professional nursing functions to assess the severity of the patient's health concerns using protocols and algorithms in a manner that provides patient dispositions to emergency care, clinic provider appointments

The triage officer provides both administrative and technical roles in the triage department. Is expected to work towards achieving the strategic objective of ensuring access to primary health care services through assessment of client immediate health care needs, classify patient through applying disease severity index and other triaging protocols. The successful candidate will also be responsible for surveillance of epidemic prone disease at the triage and take appropriate measures to identify, isolate and take appropriate protective measures to prevent the transmission of infectious diseases. He/ She will also be responsible to ensure regular health education program and activities at the triage area

Major roles and responsibilities.

- The Triage officer will be part of a care coordination team supporting general care processes alongside the providers.
- Evaluates and assesses patient's health care needs based on patient's signs and symptoms utilizing established triage protocols and guidelines.
- Obtains appropriate input and direction from the provider as needed to determine best clinical course of action and recommendations for specific patient health care needs.
- Utilize standing orders, triage protocols and algorithms appropriately
- Monitor patient flow in the clinic; ensure that patients receive all recommended services in a timely manner.
- Provide patient health education: e.g. chronic disease, preventive medicine and family health and hygiene promotion.
- Supervise staff who implement health education programs
- Assures that pertinent medical information is forwarded to proper departments as needed for continuity of patient care.
- Ensure registration and documentation of client information both in electronic(iRHIS) and registration log books by registration clerks.
- Carry out other duties as may be directed by the supervisor
