Background:

HEALTH ACTION AFRICA (HAA) is a Health Charitable Foundation in South Sudan. The Foundation is a medical cadre -led Health care & awareness raising network, grounded in medical perspectives. The Charitable Foundation was established in Feb 2017, by a medical team of friends in recognition and continuation of Humanitarian and Development work in Africa especially most at risk vulnerable populations. In South Sudan, HAA is registered and incorporated under chapter 3, section 10 of South Sudan NGOs' Act, 2016 and accorded the registration number 2526, with the Relief and Rehabilitation Commission (RRC)

Health Action Africa is recruiting staff to Join its Emergency Response Team (ERT) portfolio for 2021. The Service HAA renders include; Provision of Emergency Health Services to the Food Insecure IPC 4 Populations in Pigi Canal County, Jonglei State. This staff will however be rotated to other locations within South Sudan where there is need and based on availability of funding. We are looking for a highly competent, proactive and self-motivated individual (**South Sudanese National**) for the position of **Midwives** based in the field.

Job Purpose

The midwives will be responsible for providing care to pregnant and lactating mothers and their new-borns. The Mid wives will conduct skilled, clean and safe deliveries and support referrals of cases presented with medical complications to other tiers of health facilities for prompt attention.

Functional Duties/Responsibilities

- Support pregnant mothers in the preparation of delivery plans, give the necessary supervision, care, and advice to women during pregnancy, labor, and the postpartum period.
- Provide full antenatal care, including screening tests in the hospital, community, and at the home.
- Provide counseling and advice before and after screening and tests.
- Conduct skilled deliveries on and care for the newborn
- Facilitate referrals of complications in pregnancy and childbirth, by the principles of basic emergency obstetric care.
- Identify high-risk pregnancies and making referrals to doctors and other medical specialists.
- Provide support and advice following events such as miscarriage, termination,





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stillbirth, neonatal abnormality, and neonatal death.

- Provide primary care to women of productive age, by the Basic Package of Health Services.
- Counsel and educate women, the family, and the community, in relevant areas of health and provide a program of parenthood preparation and complete preparation for childbirth including advice on hygiene and nutrition.
- Give support and advice on the daily care of the baby, including breastfeeding, bathing, and making up feeds.
- Follow established health center policies, procedures, and objectives; continuous quality improvement initiatives; safety, environmental, and infection prevention standards.
- Decreased risk of needing a cesarean and reduced rate of labor induction and augmentation.
- Help to decrease infant mortality rates and preterm birth and take all initiatives which are necessary in case of need and carry out where necessary immediate resuscitation.
- Help to decrease the maternal mortality rate and pregnancy-related sufferings.
