Purpose of the position:

Upper Nile State has experienced protracted inter-communal conflict and large-scale displacement following the 2013 crisis and subsequent instability. Despite the signing of the Revitalized Agreement on the Resolution of the Conflict in the Republic of South Sudan (R-ARCSS) in 2018 and gradual stabilization, communities continue to face fragile relations, limited dialogue platforms, and growing pressure on resources due to returnees and refugees.

The conference aims to promote peaceful co-existence, reconciliation, and sustainable community cohesion among diverse stakeholders.



Participants will include representatives from Shilluk, Dinka, Nuer, Koma, and Maban communities, youth and women leaders, religious leaders, trade unions, humanitarian and development actors, and State Government officials.

Objective of the Assignment

- To facilitate and moderate a structured 3-day peace conference that promotes:
- Inclusive dialogue
- Conflict resolution and mediation
- Healing and reconciliation
- Consensus-building and joint action planning

Key Responsibilities

- Review and refine the conference agenda
