Purpose

The Nurse 2 (ER Nurse) is an integral part of the Juba Military Hospital, known as JMH. S/he works in partnership with the JMH incentive team and ICRC clinical team as well as the ICRC surgical team to ensure appropriate care of surgical patients according to ICRC criteria. Technically under the supervision of the ICRC Head Nurse hierarchically and functionally. The Nurse 2 (ER) is working closely with the OPD / ER JMH team members and other ICRC nurses in the different wards within the hospital. S/he works to build capacity for colleagues and collaborators working together respecting the infection prevention control within Juba Military Hospital.

Main Functional Responsibilities

- Prioritises and carries out a full range of nurse duties, including assessment, planning, implementation and evaluation of the patient's condition and care in Emergency room.
- Shows awareness of patients' changing needs and adapts the planned care accordingly in cooperation with the patientcare.
- Participates in the multidisciplinary team, patient flow, triage to achieve maximum patient outcome.
- Adheres to ICRC infection prevention control guidelines.
- Maintains safe nursing practise to all patients within the emergency room.
- Reports any emergencies and incidents to line managers, documents and comes up an action plan or SOP if
- Uses effective communication, written and verbal with all levels of staff, patients, and relatives.
- Ensures that patients, and where appropriate their families, are involved in the planning of care with cultural, religious, ethnic, and individual consideration at all appropriate stages.
- Ensures that information related to care is accurately documented regarding immediate and long-term care of
- Liaises with wards, administration, and other departments to support continuum of care.
- Monitors the ongoing needs for stock and utilises Imprest system for reordering.
- Ensures correct use of supplies and equipment in the clinical area(s) of responsibility and maintains inventory in collaboration with the count parts in JMH.
- Maintains admission/referral registration, provides ER department statistics as required and contributes to weekly, monthly or any technical/ad-hoc reports.
- Attends department, project meeting and other work-related meetings.
- Undertakes Health promotion activities relevant to patients, and the context with the ER department.
- Participates in coaching and formal training (being trainer and trainee) for the JMH collaborators.
- Participates in Patient Transfer if needed.
- Liaison with MHPSS, physiotherapy, lab (blood Bank) to ensure the due considerations for continuum of treatment as per circumstances.

Other Duties

- Requires working in the weekend and overtime if needed.

Certification/education required

- Diploma in Nursing/Midwifery or equivalent
- Registered with a valid license to practice in South Sudan.
- Good command of English (both written and oral).

Professional experience required.

- 2 years proven work practical experience as nurse or similar role.
- Excellent decision-making skills and clear communication
- Ability to work under pressure and adapt to security constraints, cultural differences, and restricted living conditions.
- Capacity to develop training program consistent with national standards and train trainers.
- Adaptability and teaching skills with leadership skills.
- Very good communication and negotiation skills and command of local language is desirable.
- Orthopaedic and/or trauma ward skills with experience in fragile context is desirable.
