## Purpose of the Position:

Reporting to the Area Team Leader (or manager)<sup>1</sup>, with technical reporting to the MEAL Manager, the Monitoring, Evaluation, Accountability and Learning (MEAL) Officer is responsible for the operationalization of the JAM MEAL system at field level. S/he contributes to activities that enhance the measurement and strengthening of JAM projects. The incumbent is responsible for all activities that support routine project monitoring, robust accountability system set up and roll out, periodic assessments, baselines and evaluations and intentional project learning.





## **Key Performance Indicators**

- Participate in project(s) design, revise the project objective hierarchy and logical frame work matrix (activities, processes, inputs, outputs, outcomes and impacts)
- Manage the implementation of MEAL plans throughout the project(s) life cycle, that is, lead on all field data collection and management, including recruitment and training of data collectors, data collection supervision and quality assurance. (focus group discussions, post-distribution monitoring, surveys, observations etc.)
- Collect, manage and analyse data from routine project monitoring, using approved tools and mobile solutions (KoBo Collect) and share with relevant technical staff and the area manager.
- 4. Produce MEAL reports as per MEAL plan(s) reporting schedule and in accordance with approved projects' reporting formats.
- Disseminate approved<sup>2</sup> information from MEAL to project management, implementing partners and funding agencies at the field level;
- Manage the MEAL activities budget lines (tracking) at field level to ensure planned activities are implemented in accordance with the available budget.
- Develop and manage an updated database and information management system for programme indicators and monitoring activities;

- Attend relevant sectoral coordination meetings to identify opportunities for integration of data collection activities, harmonization, secondary information sources etc.
- 10. Follow up and respond to complainants no matter how they are received (help desk, focal person, hotline etc) to ensure they are responded to, on time and according to the guidelines.
- 11. Support staff to follow JAM Standard Operating Procedures for Complaints Response Mechanisms. Monitor and ensure confidentiality, timely and appropriate response and correct documentation (complaints database).
- 12. Implement measures that ensure adequate information provision throughout the project life cycle in line with the Core Humanitarian Standard.
- 13. Participate in all accountability assessments and consultations with beneficiaries, non-beneficiaries and stakeholders at registration and distribution points. Develop relationships with community members and key stakeholders.
- 14. Collaborate with implementing partners and primary stakeholders to develop feasible and effective discussion events where MEAL data are analysed and programming action is agreed upon
