- Supervise the general service provision and the Women and Girls Safe Space activities implementation of the response component of GBV.
- Supervise with the support of GBV Manager the weekly case review meetings with case worker.
- Compile data from the response component for weekly and monthly report.
- Co facilitates with Senior Prevention Officer the quarterly AAP committee meetings with community leaders and representatives and monthly AAP meetings in Women and Girls Safe Space participants.
- Support the GBV Manager as Needed and Required.
- Contribute to positive International Medical Corps team management.
- Actively promote PSEA (Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) standard within Medical Corps.
