Background:

BBC Media Action is adapting its Life in Lulu radio drama from English to Simple Arabic, Nuer, Murle and Dinka languages for South Sudanese audiences. The programme reflects and responds to the current social and economic context in South Sudan. The drama aims to Promote peaceful coexistence, tolerance, social inclusion and stability among South Sudanese.

We are seeking translators to perform the following task:

- English to Nuer written translation
- English to Murle written Translation
- English to Simple Arabic written translation
- English to Dinka written translation

Job Summary:

The translator will translate written scripts from English to listed languages: Simple Arabic, Dinka, Murle and Nuer only. The translator is required to know and understand any of the languages listed above for this translator position. However if a candidate is able to translate multiple languages at a high standard, they can be considered for more translation work.

The translator will also attend recording of the radio program, ensuring that actors are sticking to the scripts and guiding the production team during recording and editing sessions of the radio drama.

The translator will be required to work to a deadline.

The number of hours work offered per month will vary but will typically involve 1-5 days' work.

The successful translators will be required to adhere to the BBC Media Action code of conduct and safeguarding policy – including undertaking a mandatory briefing. BBC Media Action operates a zero-tolerance policy concerning all forms of abuse and exploitation of vulnerable people.

Required knowledge, skills and experience:

Understand the cultures in South Sudan.
Have previous experience in translation from English.
Ability to translate for meaning, and not just word-for-word.
Good verbal and written communications skills.

Job title: Freelance/Casual Actors

BBC Media Action uses media and communications to reduce poverty and promote human rights in developing countries. To achieve this, it partners with civil society, local media and governments to:

- Strengthen the media sector through building professional capacity and infrastructure.

BBC MA in South Sudan is looking for freelance actors – men and women – to take part in an episodic radio drama programme (Life in Lulu series 7 - 8). The theme of the story is peaceful co-existence, tolerance and stability.

The casual actors will work full days or half days as and when required by the organisation's Senior Producer drama Director.

This is occasional work only, with a maximum requirement of one day per week as needed.

Actors would need to be available for a minimum of 12 months and ready to work during workdays (no weekends recordings) to be considered for the roles.

The successful applicants will have excellent acting, reading and writing ability in any of the following languages: Nuer, Dinka, Murle or simple Arabic.

They will also have strong spoken English skills, and a flair for making their audiences believe in their characters.

The successful Actors will be required to adhere to the BBC Media Action code of conduct and safeguarding policy – including undertaking a mandatory briefing. BBC Media Action operates a zero-tolerance policy concerning all forms of abuse and exploitation of vulnerable people.
