BACKGROUND:

JOB SUMMARY:

The Clinical Officer is responsible for providing direct consultation to patients attending the Mobile health services on daily basis and the overall management of the mobile team to improve quality of healthcare services in Panyijiar. She/he will be involved in training, supervising and assisting local staff to ensure that best health practices are observed, especially Universal precautions on infectious diseases. She/he will work in constant collaboration with the IRC Health officers, Deputy Health Manager and nutrition team.

Major Responsibilities:

- Conduct daily consultation for Patient attending mobile services according to MoH and WHO guidelines;
 - ✓ History taking,
 - Correct physical examination,
 - Requesting laboratory tests if necessary,
 - ✓ Document clearly the signs and symptoms, diagnosis and treatment on patient health card.
 - ✓ Prescribe medicine rationally according to correct case definitions and as per standard MoH treatment protocols and guidelines.
 - Explain to the patient his/her diagnosis and treatment plan.
- Admit patients temporarily for observation during treatment
- Identify and refer all malnourished children with or without medical conditions to the stabilization center or OTP/SFP for therapeutic feeding and support the management of those admitted to the stabilization center.
- Be available for calls anytime to attend to newly received patients at the mobile sites
- Supervises all the mobile team staff
- Ensure availability of essential drugs at the mobile sites
- Train Community Health Workers on case management of basic illnesses to enhance their ability to diagnose and mange basic health conditions.
- Explain to patient how to use the drugs prescribed during the consultation.

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- Compile daily morbidity and mortality data during the day and transfer data to the CHD Surveillance officer after consultation.
- Participate in disease surveillance team meetings and emergency preparedness and response activities.
- Organize and supervise health education activities at the mobile sites' activities and report after education
- In additional to the above listed responsibilities the Clinical officer/Medical assistant will also be responsible for any other duty deemed necessary by the Health Officer/Deputy Health Manager
- Give individual health education related to the patient's disease during consultations.
- Refer all the patients with diarrhea to ORT corner and supervise the process of rehydration.
- Supervise screening for children less than 5 yrs for EPI/ measles vaccination status and refer those who need
- Refer all children under 5 years for MUAC screening to Growth Monitoring section

Compliance:

Ensure any violations of the IRC Sexual Abuse and Exploitation Code of Conduct are reported to the Country Director.

The reporting of violations is an obligation on the part of all staff members.

Assist where necessary in undertaking activities that aim to prevent the occurrence of sexual abuse and exploitation of beneficiaries by IRC and other humanitarian workers.

Play a key role in planning and rolling out training of and adherence to MRP in coordination with the MRP focal team/person within the country program
