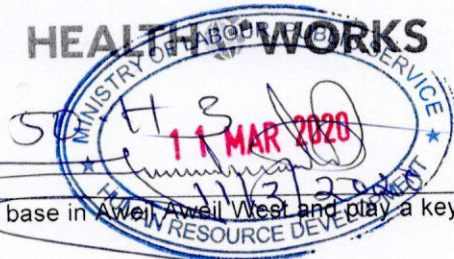


## County Coordinator

**About us:**

**Your role:**

The County Coordinator would provide support to CHD in an integrated manner. The implementation of this project will revolve around the health facility's catchment areas, the communities that they serve and through the coordination of the County Health Department and the State Ministry of Health:

**Main Responsibilities:**

- Work with Primary Health Care Supervisor to develop and oversee the implementation of the project's work plan, ensuring completion of project's deliverables;
- Provide technical support on delivering the key elements of the Basic package of health and nutrition services at the County
- Develop the capacity of the County Health Department to plan, monitor and coordinate service delivery.
- Train and Mentor CHD on effective project planning and management methodologies and quality health service delivery.
- Ensure reports from all health facilities within the county are collected timely.
- Ensure accurate quality narrative reports are submitted in a timely manner and according to donor requirements.
- Ensure HIMS is implemented at all levels of Health Services delivery. Especially ensuring health data from your county is submitted timely to the SMOH.
- Attend county coordination meeting.
- Ensure all health facilities have staff attendance registers and duty rosters.
- Undertake pro-active on the job training and Health facilities staff development.
- Create an enabling environment for dialogue, information sharing, partnerships and, and cooperation between CBOs, Government structures and target communities when delivering project interventions.
- Effectively represent HNTPO when accompanying visitors, e.g. donor and/or Government representatives, and other delegations to project sites.
- Track the performance of the project activities and outputs against expected results per facility and adjust implementation processes to ensure the project is progressing towards the intended outcomes
- Ensure SOP and quality assurance practices across health sector resulting into reduction in epidemiological cases.
- Coordinate with CBOs and community structures to improve and promote reproductive health activities to achieve MOH and donor objectives.
