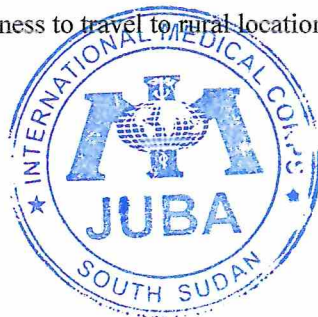
- Actively promote PSEA (Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) standards within IMC and amongst, vendors-suppliers and beneficiaries served by IMC.

Compliance & Ethics: Promotes and encourages a culture of compliance and ethics throughout International Medical Corps. As applicable to the position, maintains a clear understanding of International Medical Corps' and donor compliance and ethics standards and adheres to those standards. Conducts work with the highest level of integrity.

Ethical conduct for IMC staff: The International Medical Corps maintains a code of standards of conduct that shall govern the performance of its employees engaged in the award and administration of contracts.
