FUNCTION: Nutritionist 2

PLACE OF EMPLOYMENT: JUBA

PURPOSE

Nutritionist 2 plans, implements and monitors the Economic Security nutrition programme in selected PoDs in line with the delegation strategy and under the supervision and guidance of his hierarchical superior. In coordination with Protection and other departments, he/she contributes to achieving specific and overall program objectives in line with the delegation strategy.

FUNCTION DESCRIPTION

- Contributes to the planning of weekly and monthly activities, including the annual program planning
- Prepares monthly plans for distribution of nutrition products in the assigned PoDs
- Contributes to the planning and coordination of field trips internally, with other departments and SD teams
- Contributes to the assessment and monitoring of the food chain in selected PoD (budget and procurement, food supplies, preparation, distribution and consumption)
- Participates in the collection of weekly nutrition program data, including the analysis of the collected data based on the set indicators; Participates in organization of quarterly BMI surveys in prisons including related data collection, data entry, analysis and reporting
- Monitors food stocks and consumption of food and nutrition products on a weekly basis, also prepares and follows on the Supply Orders (SR) regarding nutrition products
- Monitors involved prison staff in food chain management, nutritional surveillance and management of malnutrition, and provides coaching as required.
- Participates in the meetings of the "Joint Working Group" and in the management of its activities as required;
- Participates in the organization of nutrition in detention workshops/ round tables with the detention authorities at the local and central levels to ensure that measures to improve and monitor the nutritional status of detainees are implemented in line with the adopted standards; Liaises with the involved NPSSS and MoH staff to facilitate coordination of activities that are aimed at ensuring adequate access to food by detainees
- Contributes to the overall analysis, planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the Program;
- Contributes to identifying and proposing local alternatives to treat malnutrition intra muros;
- Provides regular feedback on the application of the adopted standard procedures and tools by the involved prison staff in food chain management, monitoring of the nutrition situation and management of malnutrition
- Provides inputs for monthly and quarterly Program reports based on the adopted tools and procedures
- Provides inputs for monthly statistical reporting via the EcoSec Programme Management Tool (EPMT).
- Contributes to the preparation of specific reports that are shared with the detention authorities in coordination with Protection (main achievements, deficiencies and recommendations); Translates documents for internal use and interprets upon request.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS:

- Bachelor's degree in nutritional science or public health, or equivalent work experience.
- Minimum 3 years' experience in nutrition, food security or nutrition related health programs
- Proven experience in projects/program development and monitoring, including capacity building
- Proven experience in coordination with the government structures and local stakeholders
- Good interpersonal, intercultural, communication and writing skills
- Good computer skills (Microsoft Office Word, Excel and Power Point)
- Fluency in English and Arabic; knowledge of other local languages an added asset.
- Additional qualities: ability to adapt, innovate, handle pressure and stay longer periods in the field
