
The reproductive health Officer will provide the technical assistance in the implementation of reproductive health activities in each County ranging from planning, implementation and monitoring. S/he will be responsible to provide capacity building to MCHWs and Midwives in the facilities, equip all maternity units with necessary RH Supplies, essential drugs and equipment. S/he will work closely with PHC officer to review, compile and submit reports timely to M&E assistant to submit into DHIS2. S/he is responsible to track the performance of RH indicators in the County

SPECIFIC JOB DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Provide technical support to the implementation of reproductive health services in the County

Undertake regular field visit to monitor and provide supportive supervision to maternity units in all supported health facilities to ensure quality of services provision, accurate data entry into different RH registers and accurate data collection for reporting.





- Build the capacity of MCH workers in PHCUs on quality provision of reproductive health services in line with South Sudan RH national guidelines.
- Ensure all PHCUs provide all component of reproductive health including but not limited to; health Education, Focus antenatal care services, Skilled birth attendance(SBA), postnatal care services, Family planning and HIV testing and referral
- Ensure all PHCC and hospital provide all components of RH services including health Education, focus antenatal care services, Skilled birth attendance(SBA), postnatal care services, Family planning, PMTCT and Clinical Manage of rapes
- Ensure all PHCCs and Hospital provide BEmONC and CEmONC respectively 24/7
- Ensure all facilities have adequate RH commodities (essential drugs and medical Supplies)
- Equip the health facilities with medical equipment for effective provision of reproductive health services.
- In collaboration with primary health Care officer establish and maintain regular communication with RH providers in all health facilities through mechanism such as weekly and monthly RH performance reports
- Develop detailed RH implementation and monitoring plan in line with approved project activities
- Review and compile all RH reports and submit timely to M&E assistant at the county to be in cooperated into DHIS2.
- Ensure all community deliveries supported by Nurses and midwives are properly tracked and documented
- Undertake Community engagement activities on HIV, Family planning and GBV
- Ensure all health facilities have GBV referral pathways and community are aware.
- Ensure all PHCCs and Hospital have CMR guideline in use.

Confidentiality

- Ensuring the non-disclosure of any information whatsoever relating to the practices and business of RI acquired in the course of duty, to any other person or organization without authority, except in the normal execution of duty.
- Protect patient and beneficiary information.

Note:

 The role of the Reproductive Health Officer cannot be limited to the specific duties and tasks detailed herein. Therefore, the Reproductive Health Officer will be required to support in unforeseen issues and circumstances and remain flexible to perform other duties, as and when required by supervisor.



Position summary:

The Registered midwives are responsibility for all aspects of the maternity department including the Antenatal room, delivery room, prenatal consultations, the birth room and the gynaecology room, and ensures the follow up of women and new-borns under the supervision of a doctor or Clinical officer. The bearer of this positions will have based in Melut.

SPECIFIC JOB DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Antenatal Care roles

- Take history and carrying out a complete physical examination of pregnant women during the first consultation (health antecedents, previous pregnancies, fetal osculation, etc.)
- Provide ante-natal care for pregnant women following standard guidelines
- Administering anti-malaria and anti-anemia prophylaxis to all pregnant women in accordance with national guidelines and protocols

Provide anti-tetanus vaccination following the vaccination calendar
