Organizational Background

International Medical Corps is a global, humanitarian, nonprofit organization dedicated to saving lives and relieving suffering through health care training and relief and development programs. Established in 1984 by volunteer doctors and nurses, International Medical Corps is a private, voluntary, nonpolitical, nonsectarian organization. Its mission is to improve the quality of life through health interventions and related activities that build local capacity in underserved communities worldwide. By offering training and health care to local populations and medical assistance to people at highest risk, and with the flexibility to respond rapidly to emergency situations, International Medical Corps rehabilitates devastated health care systems and helps bring them back to self-reliance.

Summary of Tasks/Responsibilities

The overall responsibility of the Roving Nutritionist is to support Nutrition Coordinator and provide technical sound support to nutrition program managers at the field in overseeing all aspects of International Medical Corps' nutrition program in four states. Key functions will include day to day support in providing program support including raising PRs, following supplies issues with WFP/UNICEF, provide technical support to field nutrition managers, and

guidance on program implementation, staff capacity building, representation and coordination with nutrition cluster partners and Ministry of Health (MOH). The roving nutritionist will ensure high quality nutrition programs in line with International Medical Corps' nutrition global strategies and adapting them to specific, protocols or guidelines developed by the Ministry of Health in South Sudan.). He/she will work in collaboration with the field level national Nutrition Managers and will ensure the highest standards of service delivered are in line with internationally accepted standards and/or relevant South Sudan Ministry of Health standards. He/she will supervise the implementation of International Medical Corps nutrition program (CMAM) initiatives in the field. Guided by the Nutrition Coordinator, the Nutritionist will ensure timely execution of nutrition program activities based on assessed and verified needs. He/she will contribute to developing and implementing nutrition information system to monitor the progress and incorporate lessons within the nutrition program. He/she will help organize regular review meetings with nutrition managers to assess progress, issues and undertake steps for further improvement at field level.

GENERAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

Program implementation, quality, and reporting.

- Collaborate with the Nutrition Coordinator, Nutrition Managers and MEAL Coordinator to achieve program objectives and smooth implementation of the program.
- Assist and ensure the implementation of nutrition programs are to the highest internationally accepted standards of care and South Sudan national guideline within the Nutrition program.
- Technically review field reports (weekly/monthly/quarterly/final) and ensure that reports meet the donor's standard requirement.
- Review and submit Monthly WFP distribution reports, NIS reports, UNICEF Stock reports and other monthly progress reports and provide feedback to nutrition managers.
- Evaluate progress through outputs and impacts using both quantitative and qualitative data and involving the nutrition team.
- Develop weekly and monthly work plans that are practical, that will guide the team to
 effectively deliver services to the affected population, as well monitor the progress of all
 set project results, verse targets set.
- Work with nutrition managers in the field in identifying support needed, e.g., nutrition supplies, drugs, rehabilitation, staffing etc.
- Ensure efficiency and results-oriented performance in the CMAM and MIYCN component of the program.
- Ensure nutrition supplies pipeline is maintained by sending request for supplies on time to UNICEF & WFP. Follow up on the request and facilitate shipment of supplies to the field especially for UNICEF supplies.

 Work closely with the Nutrition Managers, Site Manager and the Program/Project Team at the site level to determine the operational needs of the nutrition programs in the project locations.

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- In collaboration with the field team and nutrition coordinator, identify existing project
 implementation gaps and new opportunities for nutrition and nutrition-related projects and
 lead on the concept note or proposal development while liaising with interested partners
 and stakeholders to ensure that proposed activities and programs align with best practice
 in the nutrition sector. Support in carrying out needs assessment to inform new program
 development.
- Prepare and contribute to project proposals for new funding opportunities, develop a
 detailed implementation and monitoring plan, and adapt program(s) to changing contexts
 as needed.

Capacity building, and technical support,

- Provide technical support and supportive supervision to national staff implementing nutrition programs in South Sudan in line with developed project monitoring tools.
- Document all processes and outputs of capacity building, coordination and management of activities to ensure experiences and lessons are well documented for future reference.
- Create and maintain smooth relations and open collaboration with local government and local stakeholders and serve as the nutrition resource person.
- Support in national capacity strengthening processes and efforts for improving quality of Nutrition service provision through facilitating training with field team.
- Work with Nutrition program managers in the field in identifying training needs for the staff implementing nutrition programs, in different field sites and develop workable training plan. Training should confirm to MoH, South Sudan CMAM and Maternal Infant and Young Child Nutrition (MIYCN) guideline.
- In coordination with National Nutrition Manager, provide basic and refresher training to the field staff on CMAM and MIYCN
- Ensure internal integration between nutrition component and other sectors such as
 Health and GBV, while externally with other partners implementing Food security and
 Livelihoods, WASH and protection projects

Coordination and Representation

- Actively participate and represent International Medical Corps in nutrition sector coordination forums at national and sub-national level, discussions and activities, serve as an International Medical Corps nutrition resource person, and display technical and organizational leadership in sectoral activities.
- Coordinate and follow-up on nutrition programs implementation to review progress
 towards objectives through organizing regular review meetings, update and experience
 sharing meeting among staffs and conduct regular field monitoring and assist in
 supportive supervision visits to nutrition program sites.
- In consultation with M & E team, and nutrition managers support in conducting client satisfaction assessment and report accordingly.
- Work closely with the M&E team to review and provide input for daily, weekly and monthly field reports in order to analyze trends and adjust the programs as needed and meet internal and donor requirements.
- Support the Nutrition Program Managers in implementation of planned activities
 according to the work plan adhering to the budget according to IMC standards and
 oversee program spending per budgets and pipelines.
- In coordination with Nutrition Coordinator and Nutrition Managers, support in reviewing pipelines according to the planned activities and ensure that procurement plan is updated.

 Work closely with logistic/procurement and follow-up on all procurements needed for the projects to ensure the procurement is done timely.

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 Maintain professional relations with CHD, UNICEF, WFP, INGOs, national NGOs and other stakeholders in the Nutrition cluster at field level

Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse

Compliance & Ethics: Promotes and encourages a culture of compliance and ethics throughout International Medical Corps. As applicable to the position, maintains a clear understanding of International Medical Corps' and donor compliance and ethics standards and adheres to those standards. Conducts work with the highest level of integrity.

Ethical conduct for IMC staffs: The International Medical Corps maintains a code of standards of conduct that shall govern the performances of its employees engaged in the award and administration of contracts. No employee, officer, or agent shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported/ by donor funds if a real or apparent conflict of interest would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when the employee, officer, or agent, any member of his or her immediate family, his or her partner, or an organization which employs or about to employ any of the parties indicated above, has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for an award. IMC officers, employees, or agents shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors, or parties to sub-agreement. These standards shall provide for disciplinary actions to be applied for violations of such standards by IMC officers, employees, or agents.

Personnel Requirements (special training/experience required, provide 6-13 requirements): Minimum requirements are:

- Master's degree in nutrition/public health and 5+ years relevant work experience (minimum 3 years in emergency response setting) OR Bachelor's Degree in Nutrition and 8+ years relevant work experience (minimum 5 years in emergency response setting).
- Proven experience in emergency nutrition settings including CMAM, IYCF, SBC
- Experience of facilitation of training review meetings and workshops
- Good knowledge on budget and administration logistics and Human Resources management
- Knowledge on writing / developing project proposals including implementation reports.
- Fluent in written and spoken English and local language.
- Ability to provide technical support for IMC staff and government staff on proper implementation of CMAM, IYCF, SBC and other nutrition activities.

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- Knowledge in designing and implementing appropriate and effective holistic nutrition programs including ensuring that the nutrition program is integrated with food security, health, and WASH programming where appropriate.
- Ability to read, analyse and interpret data and familiarity with nutrition surveys (Coverage, SMART and KAP surveys).
 - Strong communication skills, able to effectively present information clearly and respond appropriately to questions from senior managers, counterparts and government staff.
 - Strong supervisory and organizational skills
 - Advanced proficiency in the use of MS Office, and other computer applications
 - Ability to cope with stress; hardship; patience and flexibility and willingness to work additional hours to meet tight deadlines.
 - Ability and willingness to travel to field sites and nutrition facilities.
