Job Title: Policy, Advocacy and Campaign Advisor

Location: Juba, with Field Travel

Reports to: Advocacy, Campaign, communication and Media Director

Contract Period: 2 years

ROLE PURPOSE:

This role is responsible for leading planning, management and delivery of CO policy, advocacy and Campaign mile stones. The role will also be responsible for supporting specific policy and advocacy projects and events. He/she will play a critical role in ensuring accountability for results and a shared understanding of team priorities and deliverables across CO program.

SCOPE OF ROLE:

Reports to: Advocacy, Campaign, communication and Media Director

Role dimensions: This is a demanding role that requires excellent understanding of programs and project linkages to advocacy and policy influencing, project management skills; an ability to design clear and focused plans and drive their implementation; strong written and verbal communications skills; and an ability to work to deadlines and manage a heavy workload

- To lead, in partnership with ACCM Director, the development, implementation and monitoring of the organisation's advocacy priorities and specifically lead on assigned advocacy objectives.
- To partner ACCM Director in overseeing the development and implementation of the organisation's advocacy strategy, including the advocacy mile stones in CSP and the organisation's monitoring and evaluation approach
- To coordinate with ACCM Director, program and project managers, Technical specialists and business development unit in the development and submission of funding proposals and reports relating to the organisation's advocacy work, and supporting awards with identified priority advocacy areas
- Lead the design and delivery of different policy influencing initiatives, campaigns policy and advocacy plans
- Work with the communications focal points to share case studies and information from community and national level activities;
- Support and guide program/project managers in aspects of policy influencing opportunities,



campaign and Advocacy work that are project specific including external advocacy meetings, events, reports, briefs and other relevant activities

Provide support to ACCM team by leading various advocacy activities, ensuring timely communication on issues, monitor implementation of ACCM work plan for the year and supporting the ACCM director with other management and administrative tasks.
