African Parks is a non-profit conservation organization that takes on the complete responsibility for the rehabilitation and long-term management of national parks in partnership with governments and local communities. We currently manage 22 national parks and protected areas in 12 countries covering over 20 million hectares in: Angola, Benin, Central African Republic, Chad, the Democratic Republic of Congo, Malawi, Mozambique, Republic of Congo, Rwanda, Zambia, Zimbabwe and South Sudan.

Boma and Bandingilo National Parks are located in South Sudan's equatorial region with a combined area of 30, 000 KM². The parks host the largest wildlife migration in Africa that covers over 120,000 KM2, and provides habitat for large populations of White Eared Kob, Tiang, Mongalla gazelle, buffalo, elephant, giraffe and lion.

JOB OVERVIEW:

We are looking for an entry level pilot to work in a challenging and remote area. This role will require the incumbent to perform pre- and post-flight inspections, fuel management, equipment and navigational systems management, and operate our aircraft safely at all times, while receiving training as a bush pilot. A 2 year contract would be offered to the suitable candidate, with a 6 month probation period. Salary would be commensurate with experience as training progresses.

MAIN ROLES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

- 1. Carry out all flights needed as required by the operations of the project
- 2. Take responsibility for the safety and operations of the flights
- 3. Manage fuel stocks and refueling, aircraft support, helipads, runways and hangars.
- 4. Assist with any work that needs to be done on AP aircraft.





- 5. Help with servicing and maintenance, as well as continued airworthiness of the aircraft, respect the maintenance schedule and assist appointed maintenance engineers on site.
- 6. Duties to include the daily refueling, cleaning and continued care as well as manage equipment or parts and stock control
- 7. Maintain flight folio/logbook, spreadsheets and admin up to date
- 8. Be available as a relief pilot on other aircraft as required to serve the regional aerial support function.
- 9. When the pilot is not flying, he/she is expected to support the projects regular operations (such as but not limited to, support in logistics, administration, IT, training of staff, sourcing of materials, etc.).
- 10. Carry out any other relevant tasks that may be assigned from time to time by the supervisor

- Valid Class 1 medical certificate;
- A minimum of 250 hours PIC flight time
- Rotax engine experience / mechanical aptitude would be a benefit.
- Experience in bush flying would be an asset
- Willing to be based in a remote area with minimal infrastructure and support
- Excellent organizational, analytical, oral and written communications skills in English;
- Strong initiative, perseverance, and resilience;
- Strong personal integrity and dependability
- Good team player with experience working with multicultural teams.
- Knowledge and passion for conservation and wildlife is essential

Fully functional, safe and legally compliant aerial operations with:

- > Full responsibility for the maintenance oversight of organizations' aircraft.
