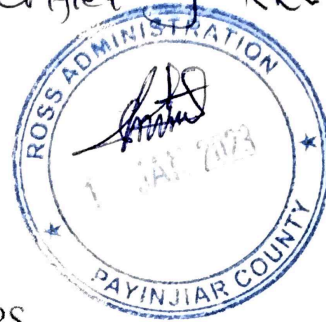

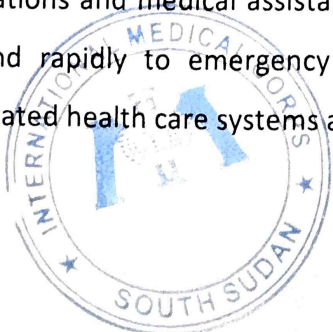

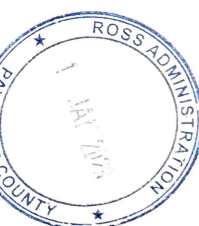


Essential Job duties / Scope of Work:

He/she will be responsible for daily activities in the facilities which among others include:

- Provide clinical care to patients in the hospital (IPD, OPD, Pediatric ward, surgical ward, maternity, medical ward, emergency room, TB isolation room, trauma unit nutrition stabilization center...) and ensure that high quality clinical care is provided to patients at the clinic/ in patient ward.
- Manage all components of the medical practice set-up and ongoing management based on the South Sudan treatment guidelines and protocols,
- Participate in supportive supervision for junior staff and provide on the job training as needed.
- Participate in monitoring the drugs and medical consumables consumption to ensure effective and efficient utilization of medicines and medical consumables.
- Assist the medical director, PHC Coordinator, Pharmacy supervisor and Program Manager in preparation of equipment, drugs and medical consumables requisitions. This includes selection, acquisition, training, and maintenance to ensure high degree of healthcare delivery.
- Provide leadership and supervise Clinical Officers including assessment of their clinical competence and support for ensuring best practices.
- Review Clinical Officers, Nurses, and other clinical Staffs performance regarding adherence to guidelines and protocols to ensure quality of care.
- Maintain highest standards of infection prevention and waste disposal and ensure that staff is to directly supervise follow IP protocols.
- Comply to IMC Standard Operational Procedures.
- Perform any other related duties that may be assigned by line manager.
- Actively promote PSEA (Prevention of Sexual Exploitation and Abuse) standards within International Medical Corps and amongst beneficiaries served by International Medical Corps.

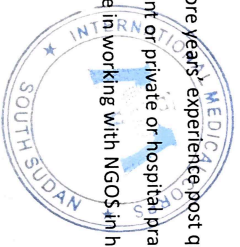

Compliance & Ethics: Promotes and encourages a culture of compliance and ethics throughout International Medical Corps. As applicable to the position, maintains a clear understanding of International Medical Corps' and donor compliance and ethics standards and adheres to those standards. Conducts work with the highest level of integrity.

Ethical conduct for IMC staffs: The International Medical Corps maintains a code of standards of conduct that shall govern the performances of its employees engaged in the award and administration of contracts. No employee, officer, or agent shall participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported/ by donor funds if a real or apparent conflict of interest would be involved. Such a conflict would arise when the employee, officer or agent, any member of his or her immediate family, his or her partner, or an organization which employs or about to employ any of the parties indicated above, has a financial or other interest in the firm selected for an award. IMC officers, employees, or agents shall neither solicit nor accept gratuities, favors, or anything of monetary value from contractors, or parties to sub-agreement. These standards shall provide for disciplinary actions to be applied for violations of such standards by IMC officers, employees, or agents.

- Licensed to Practice by the Medical Council of South Sudan or similar regulatory authority.

- Experience in working with NGOs in humanitarian setting is preferred.

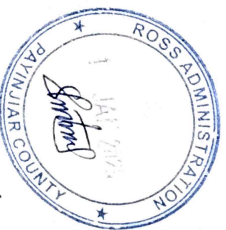
