2. Background of the consultancy

ZOA Dorcas South Sudan

ZO-Dorcas South Sudan is an international NGO that was established in March 2022 as a result of the merger between ZOA and Dorcas in South Sudan. Both organisations were individually present in South Sudan for years (ZOA since 1998 and Dorcas since 2008) and the partnership is expected to further increase impact.

ZOA-Dorcas South Sudan is implementing humanitarian, recovery and development programs, applying the (triple) nexus approach that aims to enhancing resilience and adaptation to ever changing circumstances, including climate change. It is building upon its extensive experience and expertise in especially TVET & entrepreneurship, FSL and WASH, Nutrition and Peacebuilding & Reconciliation.

ZOA-Dorcas South Sudan is active in Western Bahr El Ghazal, Warrap and Jonglei States as well as Greater Pibor Administrative Area. The main office of the organisation is in Juba, with program offices in Akon North (Warrap), Bor (Jonglei), Pibor (GPAA) and Wau (WBeG).

Project

This ToR is intended to guide a consultancy service for the 'Peace and Stability in Bor South' project in South Sudan. The project is implemented by ZOA DORCAS South Sudan and funded by Pharus project.

The project objective is as follows:

ZOA Dorcas South Sudan — together with the different communities in Bor South — will work towards increased peace and stability. ZOA Dorcas South Sudan wants to invest in new prospects. This requires a multi-sectoral project approach that addresses peacebuilding, creating opportunities for youth, enhancing food security and increasing resilience towards natural disasters (DRR), while promoting good governance. By doing so, the project will improve the wellbeing of women and men in Bor South, and reduce inter-and intra-communal conflict and instability. This is how we will work towards a resilient future in Bor South.





Background

Under peacebuilding, ZOA-Dorcas works with local peace committees and peace promoters. In May 2022, ZOA Dorcas – together with peace committee representatives – developed peacebuilding outlines which will be used to facilitate training sessions with peace committees and promoters to inform a Peacebuilding Manual.

In addition to the session outlines, ZOA-Dorcas wishes to include **relevant illustrations** for each session. The peacebuilding manual is used for training of local peace committees (LPC) and peace promoters (PP) by ZOA Doracs's peacebuilding officers and community moiblizers and will similarly be used by these actors to engage community mobilizers. ZOA Dorcas aims to enlarge the illustration to **poster materials** as well.

3. Purpose and scope of the assignment

Purpose

The purpose of this assignment is to design color art illustrations for ZOA Dorcas's peacebuilding manual.

Specific objectives

The specific objectives are as follows:

1. Conduct an explorative Field research which will inform the scope of the assignment.

The consultant will conduct an explorative 3-day field research to Bor South to:

- 1) get an impression of the context, culture and customs of communities living in Bor South;
- 2) meet with key stakeholders (e.g. local peace committees, peace promoters, partner staff, government) and;
- 3) understand the nature of ZOA-Dorcas's peacebuilding work e.g. through in-depth discussions with ZOA Dorcas staff.

2. Develop color-art illustrations for each of the pre-determined session outlines

Informed by the field research and based on the topics from the session outlines, the designer will develop color-art illustrations. ZOA Dorcas expects a minimum of 20 illustrations; more illustrations can be added where possible/required. Each illustration is to depict a before and after situation. ZOA Dorcas expects the process will require various review rounds; depending on his or her way of working, the designer can submit initial black and white sketches/ pencil drawings, and finally color art. Illustrations are supposed to reflect the context. Every illustration will contain 1 core message which will be translated to the applicable languages.

Scope and methodology

After signing of the contract, the graphic designer and ZOA Dorcas team will have a meeting to discuss the scope of this assignment. Thereafter, the graphic designer will visit Bor for 3 days for an explorative research and to get inspiration for the drawings. The graphic designer is expected to submit sketches/pencil drawings and a small field visit report to ZOA Dorcas for review. Finally, illustrations will be in color. ZOA Doracs expects various rounds of review.







Geographical locations

ZOA Dorcas works in Bor South in three Counties – Kolnyang, Anyidi and Makuach. ZOA Doracs has existing experience working with communities in these counties. ZOA Dorcas has a field office in Bor.

Topic lists & design ideas

NB: the topic are included in ZOA-Dorcas peacebuilding manual. The illustration ideas and messages for peacebuilding were jointly developed during a peacebuilding manual co-creation workshop with local peace committees and community mobilizers. Ideas and core messages may be further revised. ZOA Dorcas will share the draft outlines with the graphic designer.

6. Division of roles and responsibilities

- Give an introduction on the South Sudan / Bor South programme and security situation
- ZOA Dorcas will support with the logistical arrangements including the booking of accommodation during the field trip, domestic flights and/or vehicle movement while in country. ZOA Doras will pay the per diem rate based on its per diem policy.
- Conduct community mobilization, liaison with relevant stakeholders for the field research

Responsibilities of consultant

- Deliver all expected deliverables/outputs as described in section 4 of this ToR in a timely manner; incl. submission of field research reports and illustrations (copyright ZOA Dorcas)
- Arrange and budget for all necessary logistics incl. if applicable international flights to and from South Sudan, visa, insurance, etc.

7. Application and required documents

Required qualifications and competencies of Consultant

- Proven ability, experience and track record in graphic design and drawing of illustrations
- Strong artistic and creative skills
- Strong (participatory) research and oral and written communication skills with an ability to respond to comments and questions in a timely, appropriate manner.
- Commitment to adaptation and flexibility
- Fluent in English and strong communication and interpersonal skills
- Ability to travel and stay in remote areas and to work under pressure to meet set deadlines

Required documents

Technical proposals

All Technical Proposals submitted must comply with the requirements in this ToR and comprise the following:

- A cover letter with a brief presentation of your consultancy explaining your suitability for the work
- A description of the consultant's company or organization
- Portfolio and samples of (similar) work
- CV including details demonstrating the Consultant's experience, knowledge and capacity
- A brief narrative proposal including the methodology on how you will approach and conduct the work; including draft methodology framework, proposed timeline/work plan, tools used

Financial proposals

- All Financial Proposals submitted must comply with the requirements in the Request of Quotation and shall list all costs associated with the assignment.
- Total budget in USD, including a breakdown of the proposed activities
- Breakdown of fees (based on # days), and other associated costs; indicating rates for remote and field work
- The Financial Proposal should clearly indicate, as a separate amount, the local taxes applicable. This includes 15% withholding tax

The Proposal shall provide the following mandatory attachments:

- Business organization registration certificate or trade license issued by the country of establishment (foreign Consultants only);
- Relevant professional practise certificates, as appropriate
- References: the consultant must provide name, organization and contact details and a brief
 description of the three most recent consultancies. Each reference provided should be the
 client's responsible project administrator or a senior official of the client who is familiar with the
 consultant's performance and work.

The completed proposal could be adjusted if necessary during negotiation and will be used in any resulting Agreement.

Payments will be made in instalments based on the actual inputs provided and the agreed-upon budget – this will be determined upon signing the Agreement.

The proposal should be valid for a period of at least (90 days) from the last day of submission
